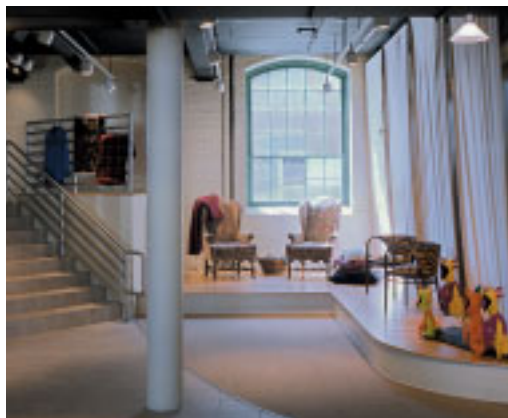


ARCHITECTS

Designed as a showcase for the high quality finished fabrics produced by Malden Mills Industries, this company store occupies space in one of the nineteenth century mill buildings comprising the international textile company's main campus. The store features Malden Mills fabrics used in the apparel, upholstery, and home furnishings markets. Open to the general public and to small business clients, the store also offers demonstrations of working with the fabrics, and sells end use products created by small businesses using the materials. A flexible ceiling grid lighting system allows for a variety of displays. The store utilizes the brick and heavy timber construction of the mill building as a back drop to set off the colorful fabrics. The building serves as a reminder to all visitors of the deep historical ties between Malden Mills' and the vast manufacturing mills of the city of Lawrence.
